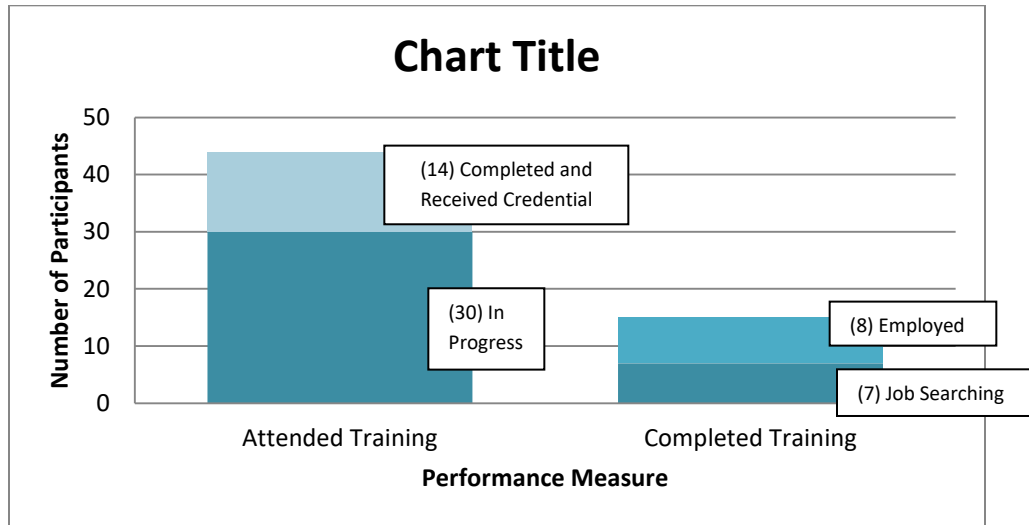
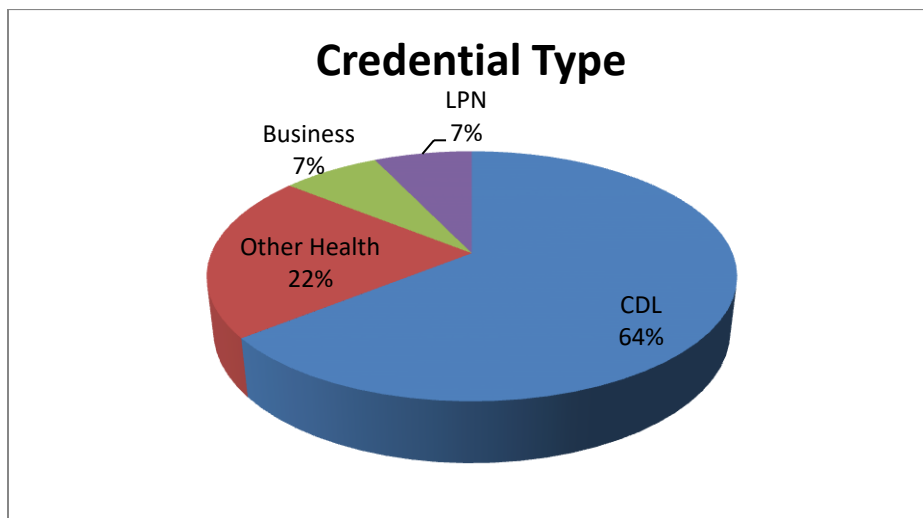


WIOA PY 16 Quarter 1 A/DW Performance

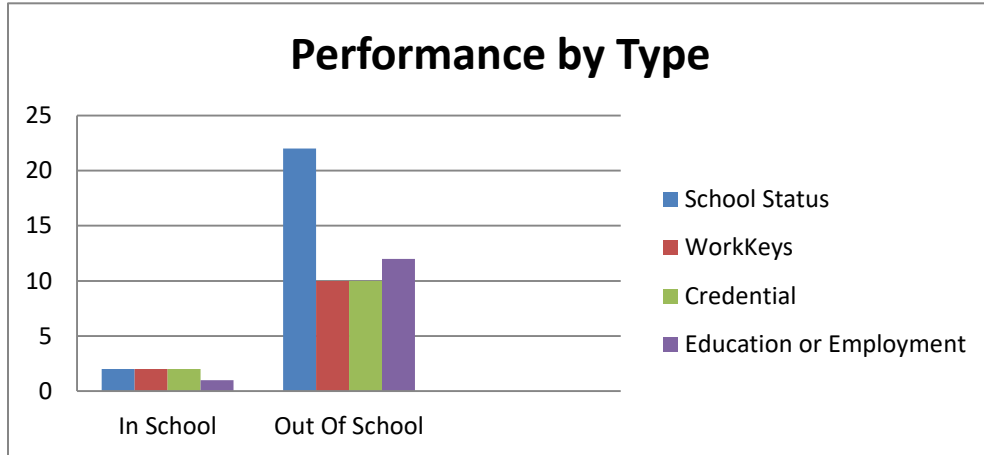


During the first quarter of PY 16, there were a total of 44 adult or dislocated worker participants in training. Of the 44 participants, 14 completed training and received a credential, 30 are still in progress with their training. There were no unsuccessful completions or participants who dropped out of training during the first quarter. Of those who completed training 8 out of 14 are already employed, and 7 are still job searching. These participants will be provided assistance to obtain employment before the second quarter after exit.

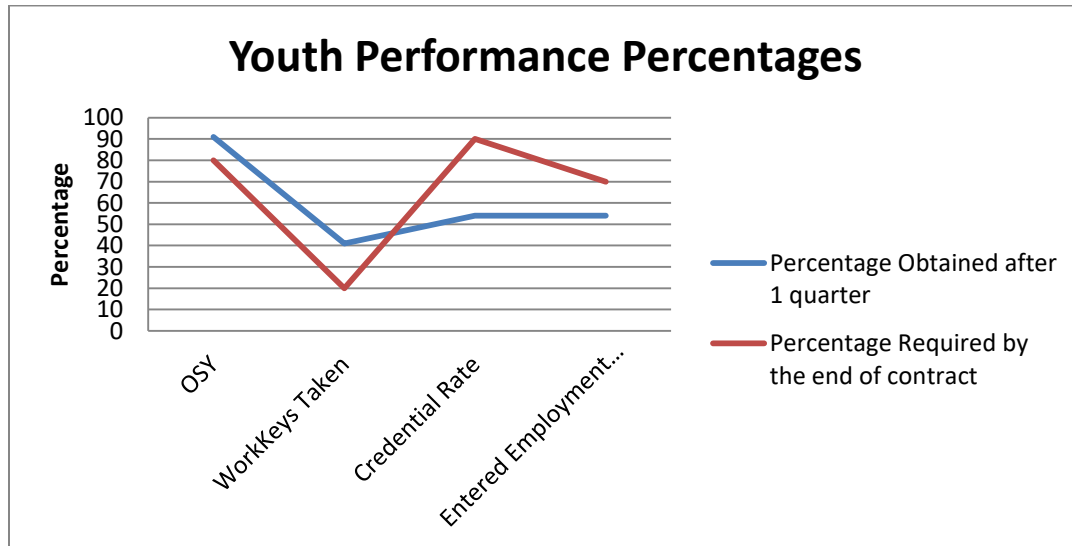


The 14 clients who received credentials, completed training in the above training programs. 9 participants received a CDL, 3 received certifications in health care careers, one received a certificate for accounts payable/receivable, and one passed her NCLEX to obtain her LPN.

PY 16 Quarter 1 Youth Performance



For the current contract year, there are two youth enrolled who are in-school youth and 22 who are out-of-school youth. Both in-school youth completed the WorkKeys test and 10 youth who are out-of-school completed the WorkKeys test. Of the 22 currently enrolled, both in-school and 10 out-of-school youth obtained a credential or high school diploma. Of those who are active, 13 have obtained employment or started post-secondary education.



Performance percentages in the first quarter are displayed in the chart above. CDSA currently has 91% of out-of-school youth enrolled in the program, and 80% is required for contract extension measures. Currently 41% of youth have completed the WorkKeys test, where 20% are required to take the test during the program year. 54% of active youth have obtained a High School Diploma, a GED or an industry recognized credential. The credential rate does not have a value in the youth measures, so placed it at 90% following the guidelines for the adult and dislocated worker rate. 54% of current youth participants have entered employment or post-secondary training.
