Jason was unable with these trainings to provide adequately for his family, especially with his wife, a stay-at-home mother of their young children. Jason was receiving assistance through the Department of Human Services for SNAP benefits, soonercare, and WIC prior to training. Jason sought assistance for the Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN) program at Meridian Technology Center with the

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. Jason also needed supportive assistance with the program requirements, such as medical scrubs, stethoscope, and medical shoes. Jason was an excellent student committed to his training. During his training, class instruction and clinicals, Jason maintained a full-time job with Stillwater Medical Center in the ICU department. Jason completed his training recently and was licensed through the Board of Nursing in Oklahoma. Jason is still working full-time with the ICU department at the Stillwater Medical Center. His pay has increased \$3.65 per hour since the completion of his training. Jason has had several featured photographs and an article produced by the Career Tech to highlight his progress in their training program. Jason reports that LPN is just a step in his career path.
